This course is intended to provide child care professionals with the basic principles of child growth and development. You will also learn how these principles affect children's learning, and best practices associated with guiding children's behaviors towards appropriate expectations, and methods associated with addressing challenging behaviors. Participants will understand the role of Developmentally Appropriate Practice in the design of quality care environments. It also studies the assessment and planning for individual needs for all kids.

- Describe each of the basic principles of child growth and development
- Take care of the good health of students
- Provide safety and security
- Understand how to do first-aid in the class
- Engage all students
- Monitor and understand all students' behavior
