PROBLEM SOLVING AND DECISION MAKING SKILLS



Problem solving and decision-making are important skills for business and life. Problem-solving often involves deci- sion-making, and decision-making is especially important for management and leadership. There are processes and tech- niques to improve decision-making and the quality of decisions. Decision-making is more natural to certain personali- ties, so these people should focus more on improving the quality of their decisions. People that are less natural deci- sion-makers are often able to make quality assessments, but then need to be more decisive in acting upon the assessments

Course Objective

Upon the completion of this two-day training, participants are expected to:

- Understand the systematic problem solving and decision making tools
- Identify the nature of a problem and potential root causes
- Analyze problems from different angles
- Analyze potential root causes and solutions
- Filter, merge and prioritize potential solutions
- Use creative thinking to develop alternatives
- Develop and sell potential solutions to influence decision
